16 **Section Headings**

17 Sections can follow the structured format of Introduction, Methodology, Results and Discussion
18 (IMRD) format. The total word count for the entire article could be in the range of 6000-10000
19 words excluding abstracts and references.

20 **Section Formatting**

21 Type each section heading on a separate line using the appropriate style from the style list. Sections
22 should be numbered sequentially. Paragraphs that immediately follow a section heading are leading
23 paragraphs and should not be indented, according to standard publishing style. The same goes for
24 leading paragraphs of subsections and sub-subsections.

26 The Introduction section should provide the purpose of the study done and the background on why
27 the study is important and what value the present study adds to the existing work on the research
28 topic

29 **1.1 Literature Review**

30 Literature Review should provide an exhaustive survey of previous studies done or dissemination of
31 knowledge on the specific areas of the research elaborated in the article. Such literature could be in
32 the form of book chapters, journal articles, conference proceedings or any other authoritative
33 sources. Proper citations of the sources should be provided within the text.

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35 The methodology section should explain in detail the experiments, techniques, algorithms, data
36 sampling used as applicable to the research done. In case of human and animal experiments, the

62 Conclusions can provide a brief summary of the findings and how it can serve the main objectives of the
63 study , It can also provide limitations of the study if any and what further research may be needed to advance
64 the field of research .
